Baseball Game Pitch Log & Instructions

The game pitch log is provided so each pitch a pitcher throws during a little league baseball game may be counted and documented. This is the <u>official</u> pitch log of the game and will be kept all season.

PRIOR TO THE GAME

1.	Write the town name in the	_ next to "Little League – Baseball Game
	Pitch Log.	

- 2. Enter the town and team name (ex. Abernathy White) in the blank next to **Team**.
- 3. Enter the team's opponent (ex. Idalou Rangers) in the blank next to **Opponent**.
- 4. Enter the date the game is played in the blank next to **Date**.

The starting pitcher for each team may be found by looking at each team's roster prior to the game.

Once the starting pitchers for each team are identified, do the following:

- 1. Write the pitcher's name for the home team in the first box in the **Pitcher's Name** column.
- 2. Write the pitcher's uniform number in the first box in the **Uniform Number** column.
- 3. Write the league age (ex. 9/10 or 11/12) in the first box in the **League Age** column.
- 4. Write the pitcher's name for the opponent in the next box in the **Pitcher's Name** column.
- 5. Write the pitcher's uniform number in the corresponding box in the **Uniform Number** column.
- 6. Write the league age (ex. 9/10 or 11/12) in the corresponding box in the **League Age** column.

DURING THE GAME

- 1. Each time a pitch is thrown, place an "X" in a numbered box.
- 2. At the end of each half-inning, the field umpire will ask for the pitch count from the official log.
- 3. If the pitch counts are different, the field umpire will decide what number is appropriate. Document that number by coloring in the final count number. If the count is 22 pitches, you will color in the square "22" square.
- 4. If a pitcher is "retired" or leaves that position, make sure the total number of pitches is colored and write the total number in the space next to the box in the right-hand margin.

AFTER THE GAME

Make sure the total pitch count for each pitcher during that game is recorded correctly. The total pitch count will be written in the *Baseball Pitcher Eligibility Tracking Form*. Both forms should be filed in the large black file box behind the tab for the week the game was played.

The above information was transferred to the "Baseball Pitcher Eligibility Tracking Form" at the end of the game. The umpires and head coach of each team <u>MUST</u> sign the form once the game is complete. View the Pitch Count Chart to calculate when each pitcher may pitch. A "day of rest" is a calendar day. If you cannot find the umpire, a local Board member may sign.
